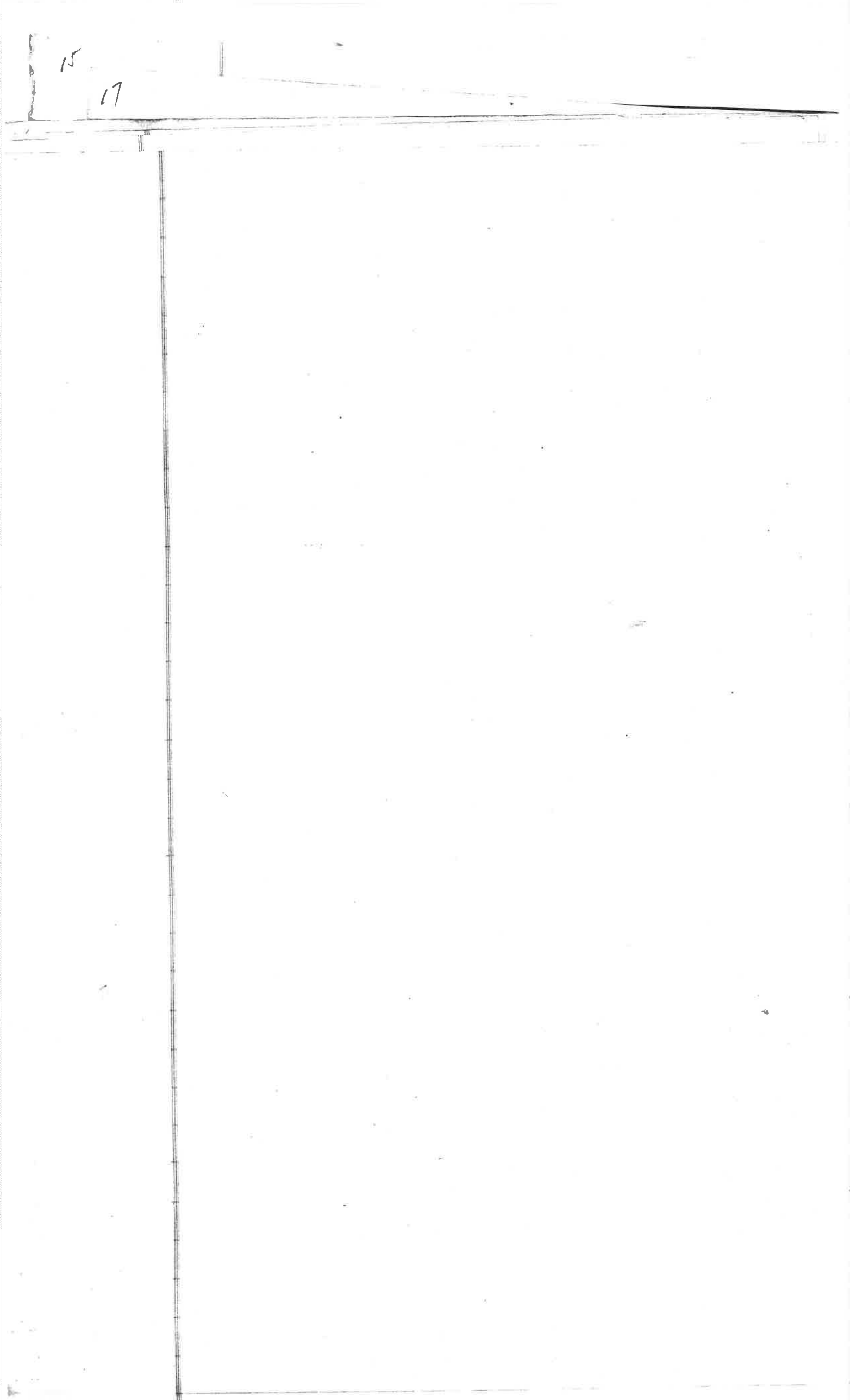

Spears received the highest number of votes for member of the Library Board for a term of six years; and the majority of votes cast in the referendum election were in favor of the Village of Glenview continuing as a home rule unit of government.

THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY PROCLAIMED AND DECLARED BY THE CORPORATE AUTHORITIES OF THE VILLAGE OF GLENVIEW THAT

Robert W. Kustra is elected as a member of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Glenview for a term of four (4) years.

Charles R. Loebbaka is elected as a member of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Glenview for a term of four (4) years.

James W. Smirles is elected as a member of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Glenview for a term of four (4) years.

Bruce C. Ogilvie is elected as a member of the Library Board of the Village of Glenview for a term of six (6) years.

Richard A. Spears is elected as a member of the Library Board of the Village of Glenview for a term of six (6) years.

The Village of Glenview shall continue to be a home rule unit of government.
